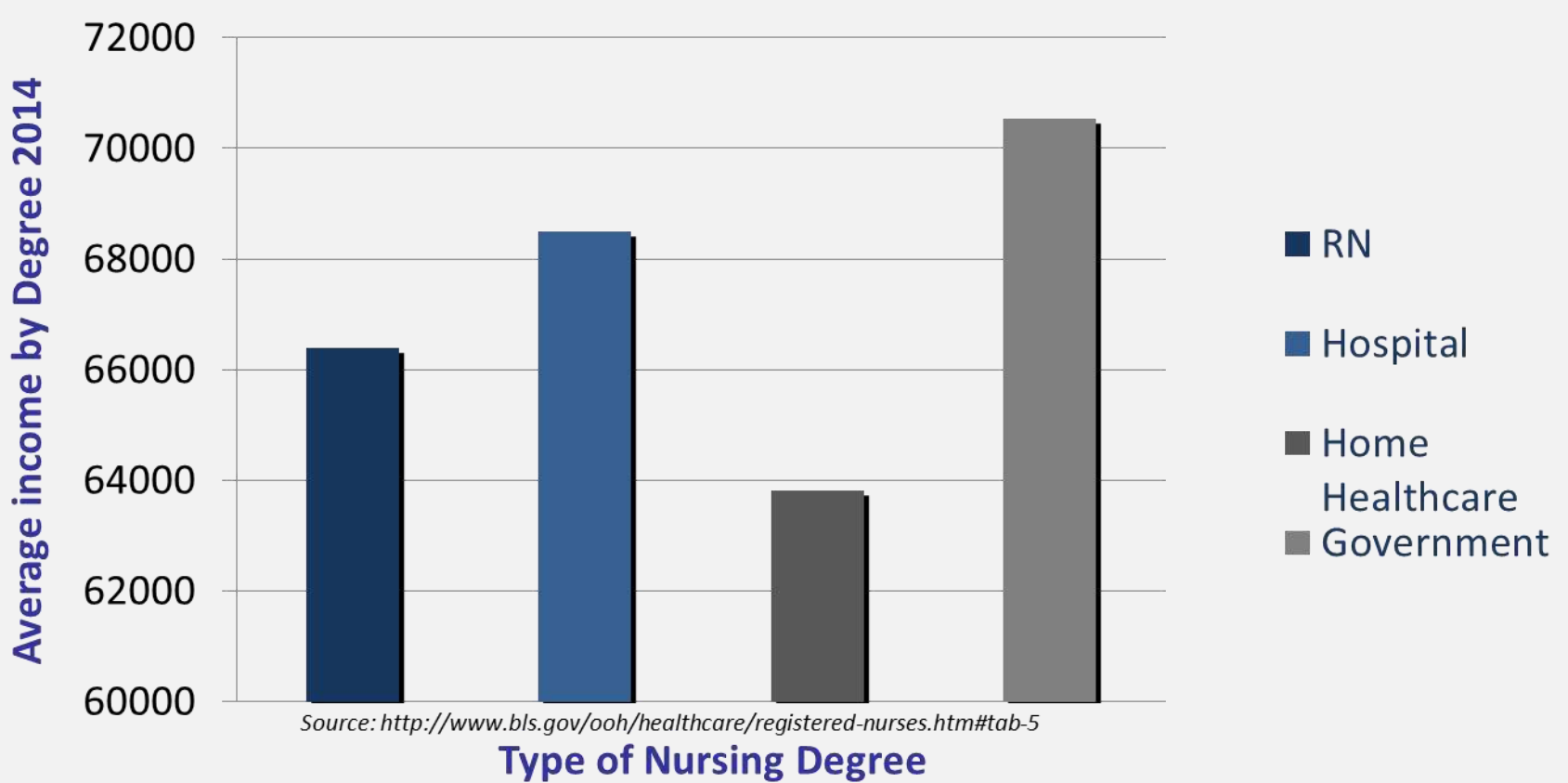


Nursing Degrees

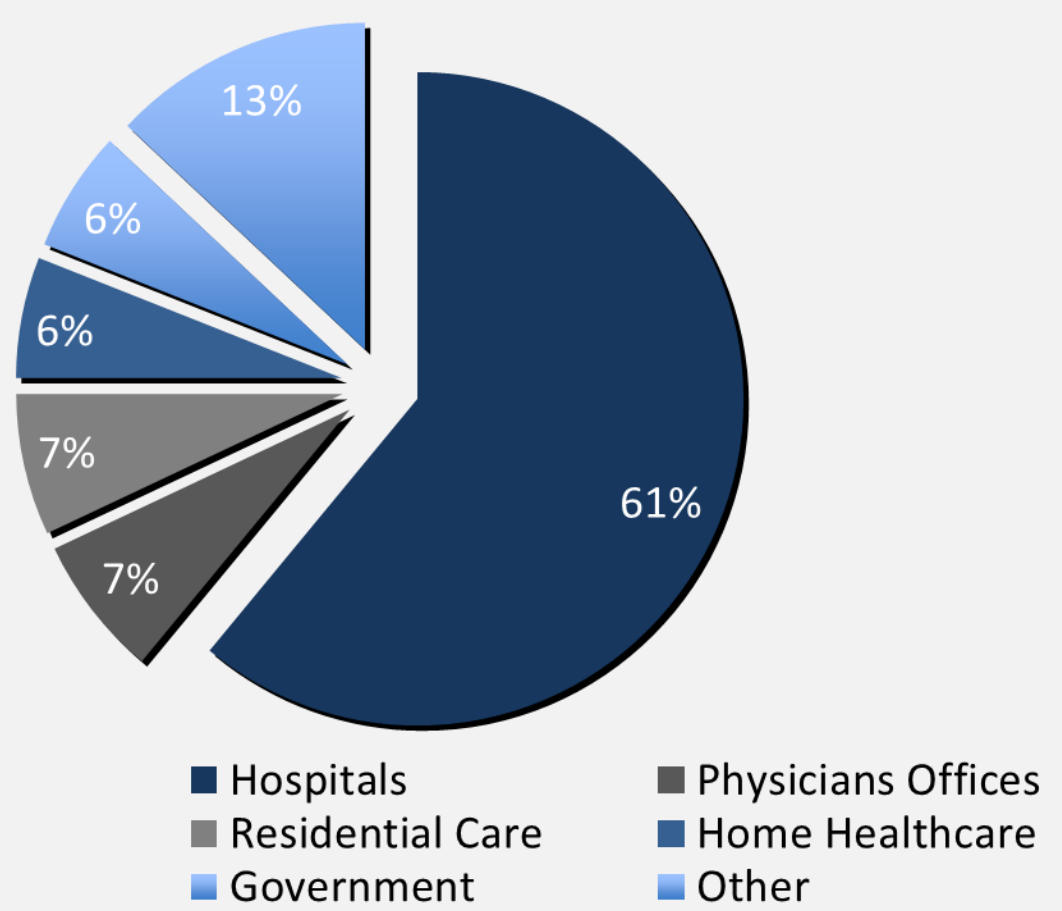

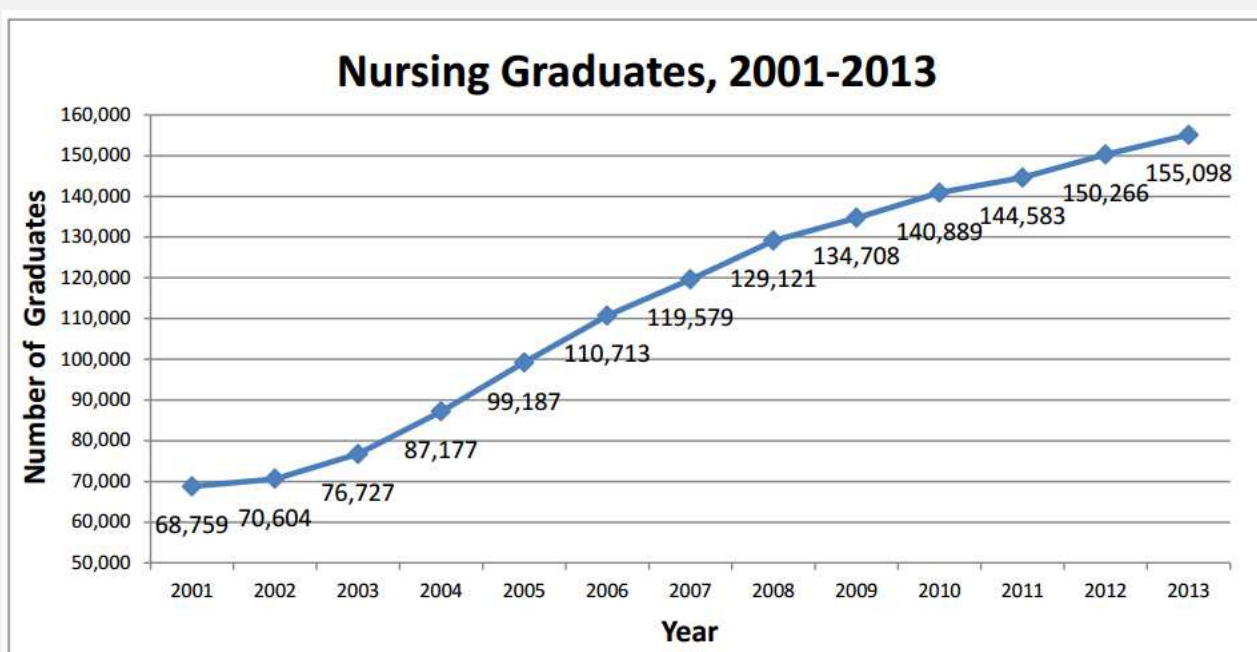


Registered Nurses held approximately 2.8 million jobs as of data gathered in 2014 by BLS.

Graduates in the Nursing profession

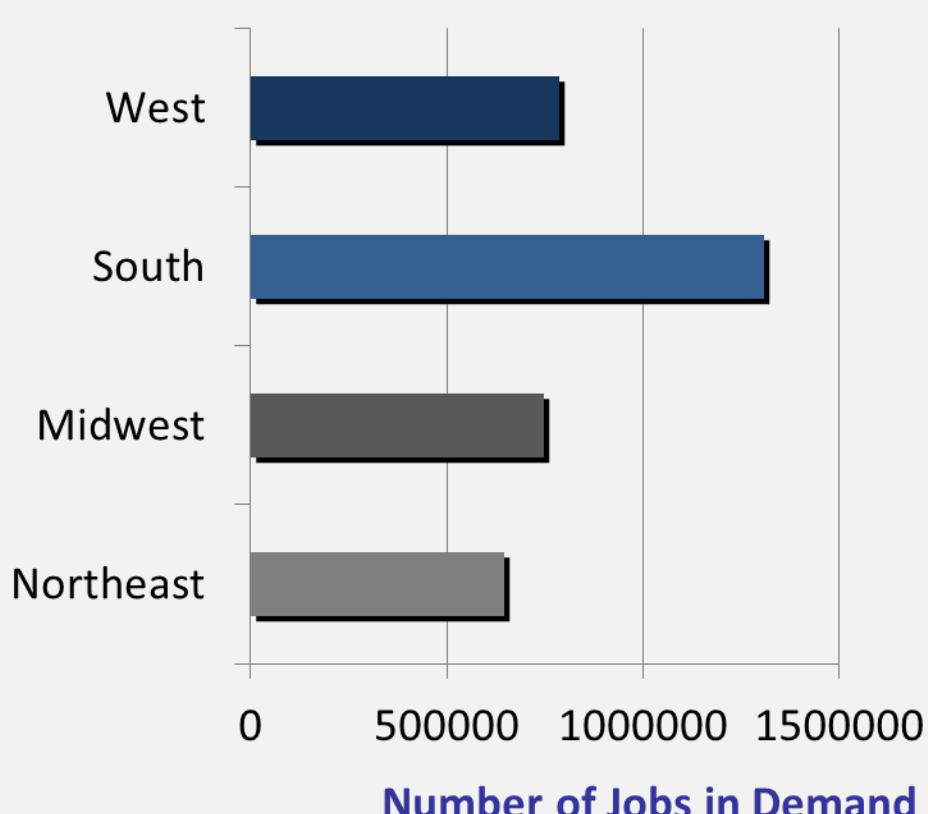

Projected Demand in Nursing Jobs in Year 2025



The US Department of Health and Human Services projects a workforce demand of 931,000 LPN's by year 2025 compared to 730,000 today. The substantive growth in the Nursing profession is projected to **grow at rate of 128%** compared to all other occupations during that same timeframe.
